

As you may know, Texas-based Kinder Morgan has proposed to triple the capacity of its Trans Mountain Pipeline to ship diluted bitumen (unrefined oil) from Alberta to new expanded oil ports in Vancouver harbour, where it can be loaded onto oil tankers for export. The proposal would result in a seven-fold increase in oil tanker traffic in Vancouver's harbour and coastal waters.
